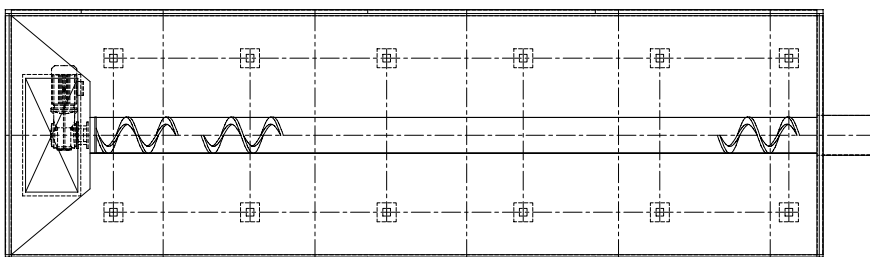
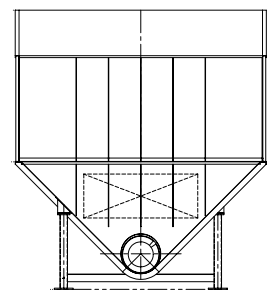
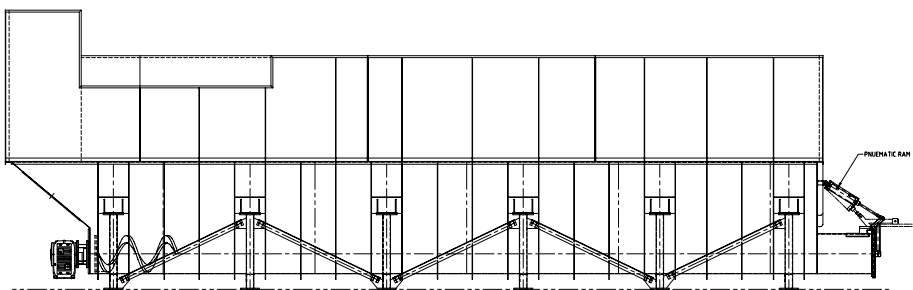
30m³ Grape Receival Bins with Large Diameter Shaftless Spirals

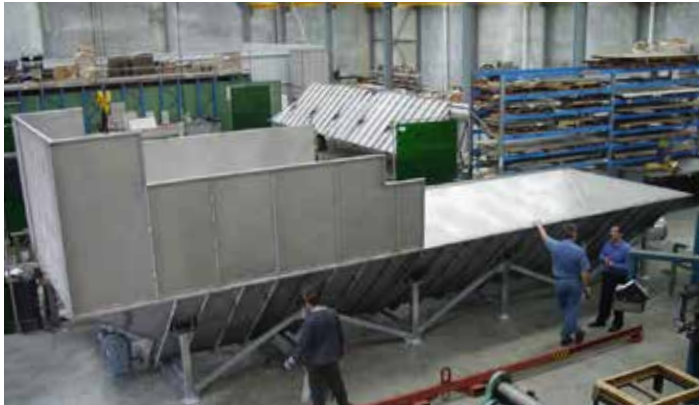


Hardy Wine Company's Berri Estates Winery is located in South Australia's Riverland region. With a 2005 crush of 209,000 tonnes, it is the largest winery in the Southern Hemisphere.

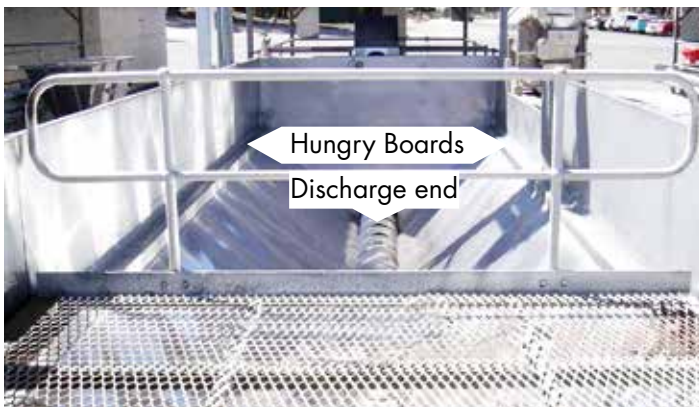
Major expansions over the last decade have seen the production facility utilising the best available technology to produce the finest possible wines. SPIRAC receival bins and conveyors have been chosen as an important part of this technology.

Hardy Wine contracted with SPIRAC to supply 2 x 30m³ grape receival bins for their Berri Estates 2004 vintage. SPIRAC bins were chosen primarily for the shaftless spiral design, strength, durability and fabrication quality. Bins in fabrication in the Perth factory. Large diameter, large pitch SS shaftless spirals provide low RPM, high torque, with minimal maceration



Discharge tunnel with pneumatic gate flap



Grapes in discharge tunnel, virtually no visible maceration ensuring the highest possible quality of wine
